Impact



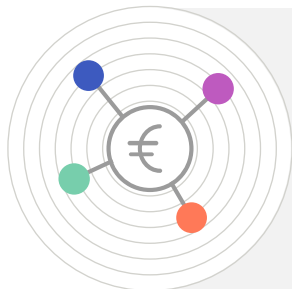
Scientific and societal impact

- Scientific discoveries and breakthroughs, development of new research infrastructures, adoption of common standards, technological applications in the form of products and services, etc.



Research careers

- 95% of researchers participating in COST Actions indicate that participation has led to career advancement



Follow-up funding

- Horizon 2020 reported success rate: 37% (on a yearly basis, around €390 million of approved common research projects spin off from ending Actions)

1. Daily Allowance

3 funding schemes

1. Daily Allowance: Reimbursement for Meetings and Training Schools

Daily Allowance (DA) covers:

- ✓ Accommodation
- ✓ Meals
- ✓ Short distance travel : up to 100 km each way

No receipts required (to be uploaded)



Daily Allowance (DA)

- ✓ Daily Allowance is based on the country of the event (Meeting or Training School)
- ✓ MC can decide to lower the amount of the DA
- ✓ Training Schools: trainers and trainees can have different DA

Long distance travel

- ✓ Any travel > 100 km to/from participant's place of affiliation and the meeting location
- ✓ Paid based on face-value
- ✓ Limited to plane, train, bus, car, and ferry
- ✓ Maximum of 1500 EUR for all travel

Plane	Train/Bus/Ferry	Car
E-ticket receipt - passenger name, dates and time, full itinerary, price	Receipt - dates, full itinerary, price	Proof of distance - 0.35 EUR per km, - max 2000 km on return

Travel cancellation insurance is eligible!

! The Action MC may decide to reduce the maximum amount.



LOS (Local Organiser Support)

Is a fixed **grant**, dependent on 3 factors:

- ✓ **Format:** Virtual/Online, Hybrid or Face to Face (F2F)
- ✓ **Number of people participating** based on the signed attendance list (F2F) and attendance logs (Online)
- ✓ **Duration** of the activity
- ✓ Grant is paid to an Institutional account and not to an individual

GRANT = No receipts required,

Grant Holder and LO follow their national and institutional rules

What is the maximum grant amount for each type?

- STSM

- ✓ Up to **4000 EUR**

- request to prepay 50% is possible but decision lies with GH Institution

- Virtual Mobility Grant

- ✓ Up to **1500 EUR**

- ITC Conference Grants and Dissemination Conference Grants

- ✓ Up to **2000 EUR** per grant for face to face conferences

OR

- ✓ Up to **500 EUR** for virtual conferences



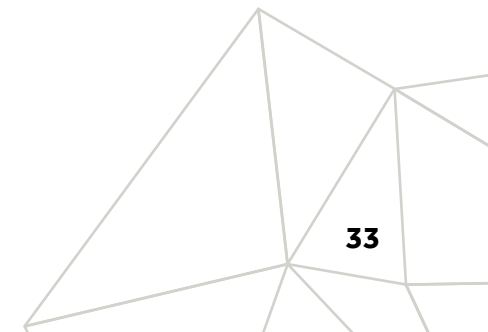
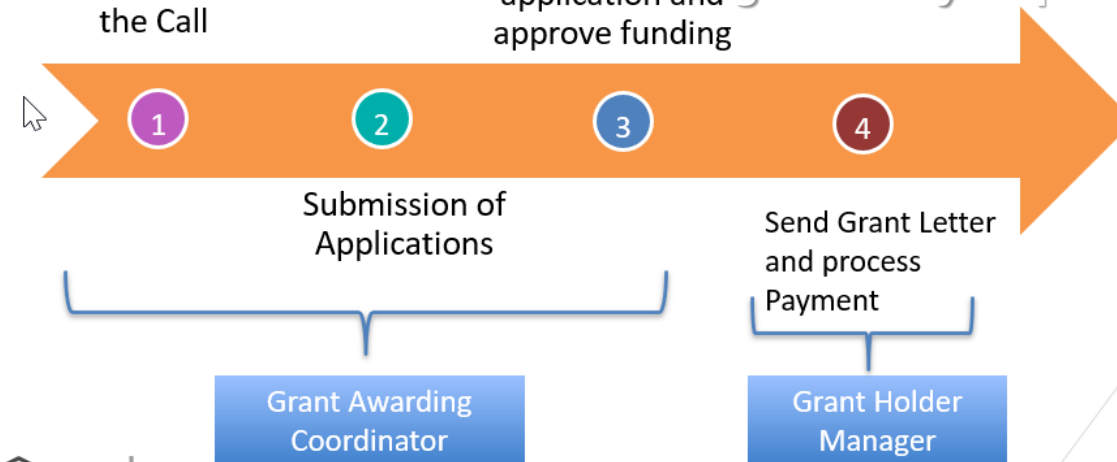


Virtual Networking Support

- Promoting and supporting virtual and hybrid collaboration as a complement to traditional ways of collaboration within the research and innovation communities
- **Individual Grant (EUR 4000 per grant). Follow on e-COST the Grant Awarding Process.**
- Selected by Open Call or identification of relevant participant.
