### **COST Open Call**

- Open to all scientific and technological (S&T) fields (bottom-up)
- Promoting scientific, technological, economic, cultural and societal innovation in Europe
- Reducing the gap between scientists, policy makers and society in Europe and beyond
- COST Actions aim at:
  - ✓ Promoting the creation, exchange and application of scientific knowledge
  - ✓ Being open and output oriented
  - ✓ Responding to COST Excellence and Inclusiveness Policy

### Step 1: External Remote Evaluation

 Proposals are evaluated only on the basis of the evaluation criteria

### Benefits of getting involved as COST Expert

- Insight into the latest developments and trends of a scientific field
- By evaluating proposals, prospective COST Action proposers can learn a lot on what makes a proposal 'excellent'
- Building reputation in the research community as a COST expert
- Contributing to the COST programme impact and success
- Honorarium of 50 EUR per proposal evaluated (100 EUR if selected as proposal Rapporteur to coordinate the consensus process among assigned experts).



### **Evaluation process and estimated work-load**

#### Two steps (with different deadlines)

- 1. Individual evaluation -> Individual Evaluation Report
- 2. Consensus evaluation -> Consensus Evaluation Report

#### Individual evaluation

- Familiarise with COST framework and Open Call guidelines
- COST Action proposals are compact (max 15 pages) and have the same structure (based on standard template)

#### Consensus evaluation


- Specific roles: one rapporteur drafting the consensus report, two 'voters' to contribute and approve the draft consensus.
- Well coordinated communication among experts is time effective



### Registering as a COST Expert on e-COST

### The COST Expert database is not linked to any other expert database (e.g. EC expert db)

- Create an e-COST account
- 2. Complete all sections of the user profile relevant to your expert profile
- 3. Under 'Scientific Expertise', provide consent to be included in the COST Expert database



I agree to be included in the COST Expert database and to be contacted by the COST Association to contribute to the evaluation and any other scientific activities related to COST (\*).

(\*) You can be invited to either take part (1) in the Open Call evaluation as an external expert; (2) in Open Call as review panel member; (3) in the monitoring of COST Actions.

Please note: You will need to register contact details of your Institution and upload a CV so we can correctly match your expertise with proposals.


### **COST Expert background** and expertise

- 1. Specify 1 core expertise (science field + research area)
- Specify additional "Other expertise", including level of confidence (Basic / Medium / High)
- 3. If your research area is not included, you may specify "user-defined" expertise areas (for keywords matching)

#### Tips:

- Do not specify more than 10 most relevant expertise areas
- Update expertise areas in line with your career development





## Open Call evaluation: optimise your chances to be selected

Experts are selected based on proven expertise in their fields, matching with the areas of expertise required by the proposals

#### Provide all the elements describing you as expert in your field

- Upload CV in English and update it regularly (every 1-2 years)
- Include in the CV all relevant experience, such as evaluator for scientific journals, conferences or funding programmes
- Specify professional homepage
- Create researcher identifier ORCID "Open Researcher and Contributor ID"
- Create researcher profile on Google Scholar and other academic networks
- Search your name in the web -> is your expert profile sufficiently visible?



### Open Call evaluation: final considerations

#### Once invited to evaluate a COST Action proposal...

- Familiarise with the COST framework and with the Open Call SESA guidelines (regularly updated)
- Respect the deadlines
- Put yourself in the shoes of the proposers: provide useful and constructive comments, which can help improving the proposal if not funded
